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
1.0 GENERAL WARNINGS/INFORMATION

SAFETY SYMBOLS:

Proper set-up and safe use of your Matrx® Shape Insert depends on your own good judgement and common sense, as well as that of your provider, caregiver and/or health professional. The following symbols are used throughout this user manual to identify warnings, cautions and important notes. It is very important that you read and understand them completely.



(CAUTION! Failure to heed the cautions in this manual may result in minor injury or damage to your Matrx Seating product, or both.



MPORTANT! Important information to remember during installation, set-up and/or adjustment of your Matrx Seating product.

1.2 IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR USERS

A WARNING! Risk of serious injury or damage

Improper use of this product may cause serious injury or damage. DO NOT use this product or any available optional equipment without first completely reading and understanding these instructions and any additional instructional material such as user manual, service manuals or instruction sheets supplied with this product or optional equipment. If you are unable to understand the warnings, cautions or instructions, contact a health care professional or dealer before attempting to use this equipment.

MPORTANT INFORMATION: The best way to avoid problems related to pressure injuries is to understand their causes and your role in a skin management program. Your therapist and physician should be consulted if you have questions regarding individual limitations and needs.

All back supports should be selected carefully. Working with your therapist and physician is the best way to assure that a back/cushion choice matches your individual needs. As the needs of the individual become more complex, the evaluation becomes more important. Regular evaluations should be performed to address any ongoing physical changes.

1.3 INTENDED USE

The Matrx® SHAPE is designed to be used primarily with the Matrx® MAC HUG Back, to accommodate moderate postural asymmetries. Normal use is defined by Motion Concepts as when the product is placed between the padding and rigid back shell.

2.0 SAFETY INFORMATION & WARNINGS

A WARNING! Risk of Serious Injury or Damage

- The instructions in this manual should be performed by a qualified technician
- For instructions on the installation/set-up of the Matrx® MAC Back, please refer to the Matrx® MAC Back User Manual (provided separately)

A WARNING! Risk of Death, Serious Injury, or Damage

Lighted cigarettes dropped onto an upholstered seating system can cause a fire resulting in death, serious injury or damage. Wheelchair occupants are at particular risk of death or serious injury from these fires and resulting fumes because they may not have the ability to move away from the wheelchair.

•DO NOT smoke while using your wheelchair

A WARNING! Risk of Serious Injury

When establishing the final mounting position for your Matrx® MAC Back, ensure the stability of the wheelchair is not compromised. Adjusting the forward and aft position and/or angle of the backrest will alter the user's center of gravity within the wheelchair. It may be necessary to reposition the front casters, rear wheels, back angle, tilt-in-space, recline position and/or seat depth before use.

A WARNING Risk of Serious Injury

Skin condition should be checked very frequently after the installation of any new seating system. Working with your therapist, physician and service provider is the best way to assure that a seating choice meets your individual needs.

Matrx[®] products are specifically designed and manufactured for use in conjunction with Matrx[®] accessories. Accessories designed by other manufacturers have not been tested by Motion Concepts and are not recommended.


3.0 MATRX SHAPE INSERT

3.1 PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The Matrx® SHAPE INSERT is a kit consisting of a fabric interface pad (**C**), a set of polyurethane foam blocks (**A**), and a corresponding set of stretchable fabric loops (**B**). The foam blocks are designed to fit inside the individual fabric loops. The foam blocks can be attached to the fabric interface pad (via hook & loop fasteners) in any desired configuration (see **Fig. 1**), in order to meet the needs of the end user.

The fabric interface pad may be cut to any desired shape/size without fraying. The Velcro™ compatible surface on the interface pad secures the Matrx® Shape Insert to the inside of the rigid back shell*.

*Note: The Matrx® Shape Insert must be secured directly onto the back shell, and installed <u>behind</u> the back support (MAC-HUG) cushion



3.2 INSTALLING THE SHAPE INSERT (onto the Matrx® MAC-HUG Back)

- 1. Remove the individual fabric loops from the fabric interface pad, and separate the individual foam blocks; Install the foam blocks inside the individual loops.
- 2. If necessary, carefully cut the fabric interface pad to the desired shape/size, to fit onto the back shell and/or to meet the specific needs of the user (Fig. 2)
- Assembling the Shape Insert: Install/arrange the individual foam block assemblies
 onto the front of the fabric interface pad, in the desired configuration (Fig 3).
 (note: foam blocks are secured via hook & loop strips on the fabric loops).
- 4. Remove/Disengage the Matrx® MAC-HUG Back cushion/cover from the backshell.





- 5. Align and secure the pre-configured Shape Insert onto the existing hook & loop strips on the backshell (1).
- 6. Align the Matrx® MAC-HUG Cushion (**A**) in <u>FRONT</u> of the Shape Insert (**2**), then re-attach the outer cover onto the backshell (by wrapping the outer cover 'flap' over the top of the back shell (**3**)).
- 7. Following installation, test fit the Matrx® Shape Insert with the end user seated in the wheelchair. If necessary, repeat steps 3-7 to modify/reconfigure the layout of the foam blocks.

SHAPE INSERT INSTALLATION:







A WARNING! Risk of Injury or Damage

- The Matrx® Shape Insert is NOT a suitable replacement for a back support cushion. NEVER use the Shape Insert on its own without a Back Support Cushion in place.
- The Matrx® Shape Insert MUST be positioned <u>BEHIND</u> the existing back support cushion (e.g. Matrx® MAC-HUG Cushion), <u>NEVER</u> in front.



4.0 CARE AND MAINTENANCE

4.1 INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE

Frequent visual inspection of the Matrx Shape Insert, as well as all associated Matrx Back components, should be performed to identify deformation, wear and tear or compression. Replace damaged/worn components if necessary.

A WARNING! Risk of injury or damage

- Do not continue to use this product if problems or damage are discovered;
- Corrective maintenance can be performed by or arranged thru your local service provider

Weekly: Inspect **ALL** Matrx Back Support fasteners weekly to ensure that mechanical connections and attaching hardware are tightened securely.

Monthly: Perform a visual inspection of all components including hardware, brackets, upholstery materials, foam, and plastics for deformation, corrosion, breakage, wear or compression. Replace damaged/worn components if necessary.

4.2 CLEANING OF THE MATRX® SHAPE INSERT

PLEASE NOTE: Foam blocks develop a yellow tinge over time if exposed to air. The color of the foam is NOT an indicator of the cleanliness of the product.

WARNING! Risk of injury or damage

- Inspect the Matrx® Shape Insert regularly and launder any fabric components which have become contaminated or soiled.
- DO NOT continue to use foam blocks if they are soiled. Discard any soiled foam blocks in accordance with local government regulation regarding medical waste.

Pi CAUTION! Risk of damage

- If the Shape Insert becomes exposed to liquids, remove it from the backrest, separate the foam blocks & fabric interface pad, and air dry all components.
- Adequate drying is a crucial factor in the care and maintenance of the Matrx[®]
 Shape Insert and the back support. All components should be dried completely prior to reinstallation.

Pi CAUTION! Risk of damage

- DO NOT use cleaning and disinfecting agents with abrasive, staining, or polymer-damaging properties such as phenols, alcohols, or bleaches. Chlorine solutions used even in low concentrations on a regular basis can diminish the life of the cover/fabric
- DO NOT use fabric softeners when laundering fabric components.
- NEVER use disinfectant agents or wipes to clean the Foam blocks.
- Keep components clear of open heat sources during cleaning.

4.2.1 General Cleaning:

The Matrx® Shape Insert can be wiped with a damp absorbent towel, cloth, or paper towel. Remove all gross contamination from surface (i.e. food particles, urine, feces, blood). Spot-clean with mild soap and water. Ensure ALL components are completely dried prior to reinstallation.

4.2.2 Laundering Instructions

The fabric interface pad and fabric loops may be laundered, if necessary. **PRIOR** to laundering, please read all **Warning Information** provided in section **4.2**

LAUNDERING THE INTERFACE PAD AND FABRIC LOOPS:

- 1. Prior to laundering, remove all gross contamination using an absorbent material (cloth or paper towel).
- 2. Remove the Matrx® Shape Insert from the back support and inspect thoroughly.
- 3. Remove ALL foam blocks PRIOR to laundering the fabric interface pad and/or fabric loops (Discard any soiled foam blocks in accordance with local government regulations regarding medical waste) Note: Replacement Foam Blocks are available for purchase, if required- see 4.2.3 below
- 4. It is recommended to place the fabric loops and interface pad in a Laundry Bag for laundering.
- 5. Wash fabric components using a mild/neutral detergent on a gentle cycle (Fabric softener may damage the properties of the foam core layer and is <u>NOT</u> recommended)
- 6. Due to foam core layer in the fabric it is recommended to double rinse components after laundering.
- 7. Hang fabric components to dry. (Air Drying is the preferred drying method, DO NOT tumble dry). Ensure ALL components are COMPLETELY dried prior to reinstallation.

4.2.3 Replacement Foam Blocks for the Matrx Shape Insert

Replacement Foam Block sheets may be purchased separately, if required. (1 sheet = 25 pre-cut blocks (p.n. **SHAPE-RF**)). Please contact your local service provider for assistance.



5.0 AFTER USE

5.1 STORAGE

(i) CAUTION! Risk of Damage

- Store product inside a protective cover whenever possible, in a clean, dry environment away from any sharp edges.
- DO NOT store other items on top of this product,
- DO NOT store this product next to radiators or other heating devices.
- Protect the product from direct sunlight.

5.2 REUSE/RECYCLING

This product is suitable for re-use. The Matrx® Shape Insert (fabric and foam), must be inspected by a qualified dealer or healthcare professional before re-use.

A WARNING! Risk of Serious Injury

- Always have an authorized dealer inspect the product for damage or wear PRIOR to transferring the product to a different user.
- If any damage is found, DO NOT RE-USE this product. Failure to heed these warnings may result in serious injury.
- PRIOR to reuse, clean and disinfect the product thoroughly in accordance with local government regulations.

5.3 DISPOSAL

The disposal and recycling of used devices and packaging must comply with the applicable local legal regulations.

Ensure that the product is cleaned prior to disposal to avoid any risk of contamination.

6.0 WARRANTY INFORMATION

WARRANTY

PLEASE NOTE: THE WARRANTY BELOW HAS BEEN DRAFTED TO COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW APPLICABLE TO PRODUCTS MANUFACTURED AFTER JULY 4, 1975.

This warranty is extended only to the original purchaser/user of our products. This warranty gives you specific legal rights and you may also have other legal rights which vary from state to state. Invacare/ Motion Concepts warrants this product to be free from defects in materials and workmanship for two years of use by original purchaser. This warranty does not apply to punctures, tears or burns, nor to the removable cushion cover. If within such warranty period any such product shall be proven to be defective, such product shall be repaired or replaced, at Invacare's/Motion Concepts' option, with refurbished or new parts. This warranty does not include any labor or shipping charges incurred in replacement part installation or repair of any such product. Product repairs shall not extend this warranty- coverage for repaired product shall end when this limited warranty terminates. Invacare's/Motion Concepts' sole obligation and your exclusive remedy under this warranty shall be limited to such repair and/or replacement. For warranty service, please contact the dealer from whom you purchased your Invacare/ Motion Concepts product. In the event you do not receive satisfactory warranty service, please write directly to Invacare/Motion Concepts at the address on the back cover. Provide dealer's name, address, model number, the date of purchase, indicate nature of the defect and, if the product is serialized, indicate the serial number.

Invacare Corporation/Motion Concepts will issue a return authorization. The defective unit or parts must be returned for warranty inspection using the serial number, when applicable, as identification within thirty (30) days of return authorization date.

DO NOT return products to our factory without our prior consent. C.O.D. shipments will be refused; please prepay shipping charges.

LIMITATIONS AND EXCLUSIONS: THE WARRANTY SHALL NOT APPLY TO PROBLEMS ARISING FROM NORMAL WEAR OR FAILURE TO ADHERE TO THE ENCLOSED INSTRUCTIONS.
